### Opening our 2023-2024 season



Our first monthly playing will be at Zion Lutheran on September 8<sup>th</sup> with Andy Canepa, which is a Friday evening (7:30pm to 9:30pm Pacific). Bay Area trained early musician and pianist Andy Canepa works within an exciting early music community in the Bay Area, performing music from the medieval period to the 20<sup>th</sup> Century as a conductor, harpsichordist, organist, percussionist and pianist. After receiving Bachelor and Master of Music degrees, he began Bay Area studies in conducting and also in vocal technique.


We have returned to our usual Zion Lutheran (5201 Park Blvd, Piedmont) location for regular monthly playing, but also expect to continue streaming online (with use of Zoom) for an alternative. We will be requiring at-home Covid testing the day of the playing, and if possible, bring your NEGATIVE test to the event in a zipped baggie, or a date-stamped photo otherwise. Of course, positive tests STAY HOME, as well as if you have symptoms of *any* illness.

Members will also receive, around the month's end before the next month's playing session, an email including the Zoom-link and password.

Our last playing session for the 2022/2023 playing session June 2 included an election with voting by those attending in person as well as by Zoom. In the process of considering the adoption of bylaws (and then the drafting of same) we began "digging" into our history. Susan Jaffe found a certificate from the ARS commemorating our "51st birthday" at the 2009 Festival and Conference (certificate to the left). Suzanne Siebert sought to trace our history as a SFEMS Affiliate. (As a SFEMS Affiliate we share various benefits,

### **Recorder Community news from the Summer**

The FLOW State—a pleasurable sense of being absorbed and focused in one activity. To achieve this, you might clear your calendar for two weeks of workshops with San Francisco Early Music Society. I spent the end of July "in flow" attending SFEMS Medieval-Renaissance ("Med-Ren"), directed by Adam Gilbert, immediately followed by Recorder Week, directed by Annette Bauer. 9:00 am to 5:00 pm classes and evening events required a lot of stamina, both physical and mental, and yet I felt more inspired and energized than tired.

The 40-50 participants included members of our EBRS chapter as well as musicians from San Francisco, Sonoma, the Peninsula, Southern California, Pennsylvania, Colorado, Texas, Washington (among other states), plus a few from Canada. While some of us commuted from our homes in the East Bay, most stayed in townhouse-style dormitories on campus at St. Mary's college in Moraga. Class offerings were so varied and appealing that it was difficult to choose—like being at a lavish wedding buffet, and not having room on the plate for all the delicacies. My own days included German Renaissance music, French Chansons (4 of us musicians playing with 8 singers), Scottish tunes, "Finding Hidden Notes", medieval consort music, lunch-hour master classes, and more.

Each morning we took our seats for a tutti playing session, culminating in Friday evening student and faculty concerts. With voices, historical brass and reed instruments joining us at Med-Ren, we produced a richly textured sound. For Recorder week, we played our "sweet pipes" like an organ performing a program that spanned six centuries.

We are so privileged here in the Bay Area to have the SFEMS summer workshops, which give us opportunities to study with some of the best early music coaches in the world, improve technique, explore new repertoires, geek-out with other early music enthusiasts, play and socialize with old friends and new. ### President's message

#### Welcome to a New Year of the East Bay Recorder Society!

I hope that everyone had a fun summer of music making. Many members attended one or more of the Bay Area SFEMS workshops, as well as other workshops around the country. The workshops are always inspirational and very enjoyable for me. I think that playing with friends is one of the biggest pluses of being a recorder player.

#### **Membership Dues & EBRS Bylaws**

In September, we'll begin our regular playing sessions and newsletter distribution. A new year means that it is time to pay your annual membership dues. Our EBRS Board of Directors decided that dues need to be increased to \$70/year. At \$70/member/year, the cost is still less than \$10/month. Please print and fill out the membership form in this newsletter and (snail) mail it to Mary Ann. On your registration form, please also vote either YES or NO regarding the acceptance of the EBRS Chapter Bylaws. (This vote is why PayPal is not an option for membership renewal this year.)

#### **Background**

Why the dues increase?

EBRS lost money in the last fiscal year. A major increase in our expenses is the cost of professional conductors for our monthly meetings. Conductor fees went from \$225 to \$300 / session. That's a 33% increase. This raise is consistent with a good "going rate" for professional musicians. It is important that we support our teachers. As a large recorder chapter, we need to take a stand with financial support.

Historically, EBRS workshops have been a source of income. For the last 5 years or so, this has not been the case. Our workshops have broken even financially, but have not been money makers. Workshop attendance is down. This was true even before COVID. Furthermore, venue rental costs, especially the Y at the Headlands, have increased.

Why do we need Bylaws? We need Bylaws to be clear about who, when, and how decisions for EBRS are made. Specifically, this means definition of the board composition and requirements for voting on various issues. We also want to ensure that we have multiple people reviewing our operations, especially the financials. This helps us all achieve the best outcomes.

I want to extend a hug thank you to Carol Coon and Suzanne Siebert for writing our Bylaws and revising them multiple times. They did much research into what other chapters in the U.S. are doing. I think that we have a good document.


